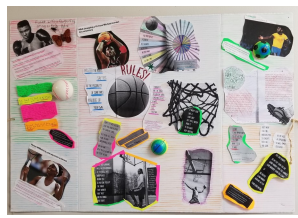
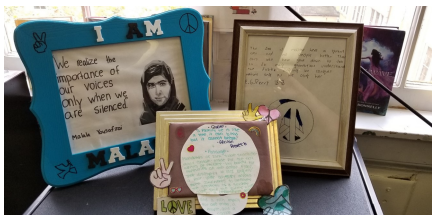
Important Reminder From Waste Management:

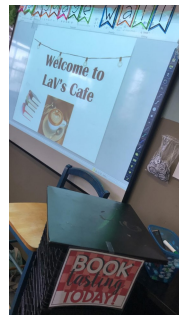

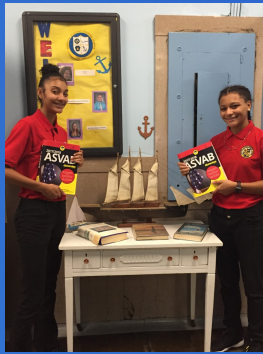

creates more opportunities with the National Coastal Guard. Here at Maritime, we hope to inspire our students to take language acquisition seriously and presentations like these inspire students to do so.



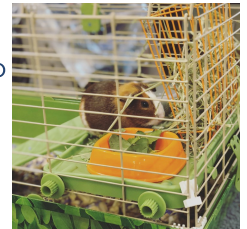
