Cadets made progress this month on the boat, cutting and installing the transom and attaching the planks and frames. Cadets expect to launch on June 1.







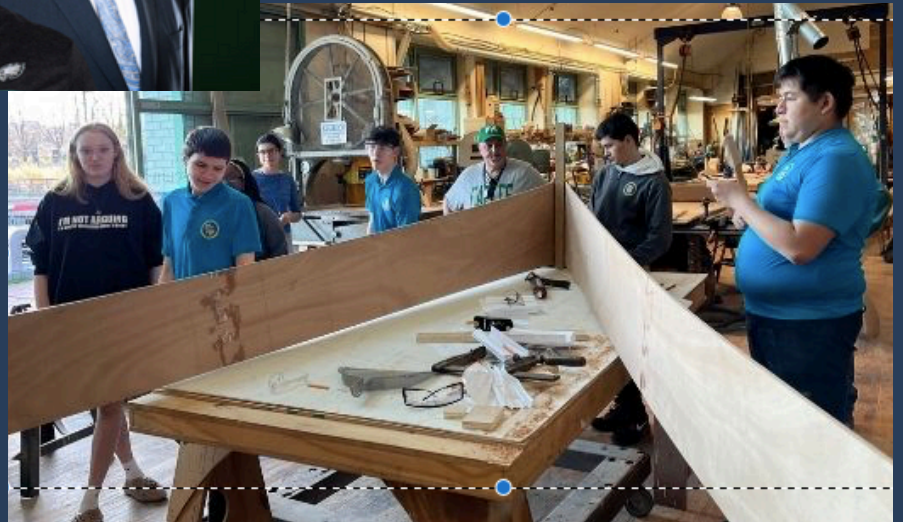
